Withdrawal of the Monti II Regulation	11.9.2012	Single Market	Due to the protests of the EU Parliament, the private employers and the European trade unions, the European Commission decided to withdraw its proposal for a Council Regulation on the exercise of the right to take collective action within the context of the freedom of establishment and the freedom to provide services, commonly known as the Monti II Regulation. According to the proposal, the economic freedoms could prevail on the exercise of the right to take collective action. The European Commission will work on a new proposal.

Public consultation on the TOP10 most burdensome EU legislative acts	28.9.2012	Enterprises	As complaints are often aired about the red tape created by European law, the European Commission launched a public consultation to help her to identify the top ten EU legislative acts considered most burdensome by micro-companies and SMEs.
