



## CLGE opening speech for the Geomatics on the Move Contest

Dear Fiammetta, Dear Edward, Dear Colleagues and Friends,

Here we are at the Awarding Ceremony, after a lot of work and a long preparation of this first combined edition of the Geomatics on the Move Contest.

As CLGE President, I am very satisfied about our very strong and positive cooperation with the GSA in this field and others. We started the idea about the Contest ten years ago, and can already look back now on nine fruitful editions. After only a few years, the GSA started to support us in this effort, and with this edition it became a real joint venture.

With this Contest, we want to motivate Geodesy students, young surveyors and entrepreneurs to be active in our sector. Within the Geomatics segment, we are big users of E-GNSS, hence it was quite an opportunity for us when we heard that the GSA was willing to cooperate more closely with us in this area.

The initial idea of the Contest was based on the fact that in many, especially Western European countries, there is a lack of candidates to embrace professions in the field of geodetic engineering and property surveying. We started to organise an annual European Students' Meeting and every third year we organised their participation in INTERGEO.
