



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN CLGE and EUROGI

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is to establish a collaborative relationship between the Council of European Geodetic Surveyors (CLGE) and the European Umbrella Organisation for Geographic Information (EUROGI). Both parties to this MoU share the goal of promoting cooperation and mutual support.

CLGE is an umbrella organisation and permanent forum for European geodetic surveyors and represents over 100,000 surveyors from more than 40 Council of Europe countries. CLGE's members comprise the national professional survey association bodies of the constituent member countries. CLGE was founded in 1962 and exists to represent and promote the geodetic surveying profession throughout Europe. Its initiatives include; professional cooperation and partnership, exchange of knowledge and expertise, advice and representation on professional matters to member countries, national associations and the European Union, development of professional qualifications and standards and participation in other relevant organisations within Europe and worldwide.

EUROGI is an umbrella organisation with membership from across Europe with a mission to promote the widespread and effective use of geospatial information and technologies in Europe. Its initiatives include development of policy positions, liaison with the European Union, promotion of education and capacity building, participating in EU funded projects, liaison with other European organisations in the broadly defined geospatial domain, and information sharing.

CLGE and EUROGI agree to cooperate in the following activities, which are to their mutual benefit:

- Establish a structural cooperation
- Provide mutual support in respective projects
- Foster the cooperation between our respective national members
- Provide mutual support in communications and publicity of respective events
- Identify opportunities to attend, present, and conduct workshops, at each other's events, and other events

The signatories will aim for two joint annual meetings or events, one of them, at least partly, dedicated to the evaluation and eventual improvement of this MoU.
